The sustained growth of our contributed income - ie donations shows that our community believes in the importance of art and culture. Despite our history as the 4Cs, founded in 1992, the Cultural Center still feels like a young organization — a place with so much room to grow and improve, where things move pretty fast. Before we travel too far into 2018, however, let's take a moment to celebrate a few highlights of 2017:

- The launch of the first Art on the Edge Studio Tour, a project of the PJ Chessman Gallery
- Re-design and upgrade of the LCCC Members Gift Shop & Lincoln City Visitor Information Center. Fresh paint, new desks and more.
- Four new exterior doors in the lower

level, paid for by the City of Lincoln City.



- A record-breaking fundraising gala featuring a performance by the Cascadia Concert Opera (above).
- A new partnership with Theatre West, including two productions on the LCCC stage (plus a new box office and reserved seating options)
- The annual Festival of Illusions, our spring break family-friendly program, expanded to 11 days
- An expanded advertising program, supported by a grant from the Lincoln City VCB, spread in the Portland and Eugene markets.

A COMMUNITY RESOURCE

In 2017, the Lincoln City Cultural Center was the host for 351 events attracting more than 39,000 patrons. Of those programs, 55 were primarily in the visual arts, 112 were performing arts and 61 were provided specifically for youth under the age of 18. The number of events that were free or by donation: 72.

The LCCC was proud to collaborate with Theatre West, Lincoln City's own community theatre, to produce two plays in 2017. In April, there were four free performances of "Love, Loss, and What I Wore" by Nora and Delia Ephron (above). In October-November, the four-week run of "Calendar Girls" was seen by 854 people. To facilitate this partnership, and improve our capacity for similar events in the future, the LCCC expanded our ticketing system to include reserved seating. We also installed a beautiful new box office window (funded by grants from the VCB and the Lincoln County Cultural Coalition).

Festival of Illusions expands

In 2017, after five years of success and quite a few sold-out houses (like those for The Amazing Bubble Man, above), we doubled the size of our annual Festival of Illusions spring break schedule. Supported by a grant from the Lincoln City Visitor & Convention Bureau, the festival expanded from 6 to 11 days of magic camps, art workshops and evening performances. The additional week is designed to target a second group of tourists: families from SW Washingon and Idaho, spending their spring breaks on the Oregon Coast.



Capacity Building Project

In August, the LCCC was chosen to participate in a training and mentorship program led by arts management author and former Kennedy Center for the Arts director Michael Kaiser (above, with director Niki Price and board members Greg Berton and John Collier). This program, funded by the Oregon Community Foundation, the Collins Foundation and others, has resulted in our ambitious 5-year arts plan and a new approach to donor development. Through this program, we're also learning more about institutional marketing and digital strategies — all at no cost to the LCCC.
